Japanese Status Gakkou-Houjin



Last February, with nearly 80% of votes in favor, you approved the submission of the application for Gakkou-Houjin status—a significant step forward aimed at granting LFIK legal recognition in Japan and, ultimately, providing numerous benefits for students and their families. Thus, obtaining the status of a "legal entity" is a mandatory requirement to apply for a genuine long-term lease to use the heritage properties of the city of Kyoto. This process initiates the eligibility review of the application, which will take place between April and June. Then, we will formalize our

Nearly 80% of you also supported the launch of an annex in Osaka, provided it maintained financial autonomy, ensuring that no additional burden would fall on APEK families.
