Ordinary General Assembly : summary of decisions



The APEK Ordinary General Assembly was held on Saturday, November 15th. Out of 204 families, 50 were represented - either in person or by proxy - representing a 24% participation rate. Although still low for ensuring full representativeness, it nonetheless allowed the adoption of the following resolutions:

- Approval of the 2024-2025 financial results and activity report
- Approval of the 2025-2026 budget
- Adoption of a statutory modification introducing a progressive quorum (the OGA may now be held regardless of the number of families represented; votes are counted based on the percentage of those present or represented)

Additionally, three members of the Management Committee whose terms were ending stood for re-election:

- Ms. Kae Debayles-Oki
- Mr. Glen Bedjanian
- Mr. Romain Rallu

All three were re-elected. Congratulations to them, and thank you for their continued commitment - particularly valuable as they were the only candidates, ensuring the Management Committee remains complete (between six and nine members).

A Look at the School: A Testimonial from Mr. Lecacheur, Behind the scenes at our establishment



Since I became involved in school life, I have worn many hats. First as a parent (I have two children, currently in 11th and 8th grade), then as a volunteer, then as secretary of the APEK, then as president, then as CFO, and now in charge of IT and communications. Over time, we joke about it: I've been lucky enough to have many roles at the school. And this journey has given me one very valuable thing: a very concrete understanding of what goes on behind the scenes.

As parents, we naturally want the best education for our children. That's why we choose this school and why we are so attached to it. But very quickly, when we start to get involved, we understand that this ambition must be built within a real framework, with our resources, our constraints, and constant trade-offs. We have to balance objectives that are not always easy to reconcile: offering a demanding and caring education, ensuring safety, improving reception conditions, developing the school, while maintaining an acceptable level of fees for families.

We also discover that a school is not just an educational project: it is a living organization. The Management Committee does not only manage figures, files, and buildings. It must also take care of its staff, as in any structure: there are everyday issues, difficulties, expectations, desires for change, and often needs to anticipate. At the same time, it must support the school in terms of its image, communication, and ability to make itself known and understood. In my current position, I realize how much this requires constant investment and availability: explaining, reassuring, promoting, attracting, building a solid reputation, while remaining true to who we are.

If there is one thing I can testify to with conviction, it is the tremendous work of our teachers. I have seen it up close, particularly during discovery classes, in the way they support students on a daily basis, and also in the attention they pay to career guidance projects. There is a generosity, a high standard, and a level of involvement that cannot be summed up as simply "teaching." They are the ones who give meaning to our project, and it is thanks to them that students grow up in an environment that is both structured and humane.

With this background, I would simply like to reiterate one idea: our school is built for the long term. It moves forward because people are committed, sometimes deeply, often discreetly. And if we want it to continue to grow steadily, many of us must maintain this overall vision, beyond our role as parents. Everyone, at their own level, can contribute to this movement, and it is this combined energy that will make the difference in the years to come.
